ADMISSIONS TO PRIMARY SCHOOL SEPTEMBER 2020

If you have a child who has their 4th birthday between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020, you must now apply for their place in Primary School. You still need to make an application even if they have a brother or sister at your chosen school. Applications should be made online to Lancashire County Council at www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools

It is quick and easy to do and you will receive an email confirmation of your application. The deadline for all September 2020 applications is 23.59 on 15th January 2020

ARE YOU ENTITLED

If you think that you may be entitled to Free School Meals, don't forget to apply in order to receive this and other associated benefits. School will also receive funding for this via the Pupil Premium scheme even if you choose to have a packed lunch or currently receive a Universal Free School Meal as your child may be in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2. PE KITS

Please ensure that your child has their PE kit in school with them **EVERY DAY**. These should be sent into school at the start of every term, and be left at school until they are taken home to be washed at the end of term. To assist in returning any missing items to pupils please ensure that all kit is clearly labelled with your child's name.

WOULD YOU LIKE TO BE A CLASSROOM HELPER?

Classroom helpers usually commit to spending regular slots of time in school each week. This time can vary from half an hour to half a day at most. Many schools including Longsands prefer not to put you in your child's class because we consider it to be disruptive for your child, and possibly unfair to classmates whose parents are unable to volunteer. Classroom helpers make a big difference in improving standards. Even if you're not helping in your child's class, research shows that having a parent who volunteers improves a child's experience of school. This may be because you're 'plugged in' to school and know what goes on during their day. It's a great way to get behind the scenes. Classroom helpers volunteer to assist teachers on a **regular** basis, usually in primary schools. They help with tasks like **listening to** pupils read. Reading practice is very labour intensive, and helpers can make a big difference to teachers and children.

Classroom helpers are often, but not always, parents of children at the school and are not the same as classroom assistants, who are paid staff. If you would be interested in volunteering please email Mrs McKeown by Friday 13th September to

Dear Parent/Guardian,

After a successful trial last year, Longsands is going to be using an online tool called Seesaw throughout the school. It's a secure online learning journal where children can create and upload their work to document their learning. Your child will add things like photos, videos, worksheets, drawings and voice recordings to their Seesaw journal. Seesaw journals are private and only accessible by the teacher, pupils, and their parents. On most occasions, children will post photos of their own independent work, complete tasks online or upload work which they have word processed. Sometimes however, children may upload work which they have completed in pairs or small groups – this may be a photo or video including other children. In these situations, the work or image will be visible to the parents of all children involved. Please indicate below if you do not wish your child to upload pictures or videos of themselves working in a group with others.

You can also sign up for a free Seesaw parent account, download the parent app to your phone (giving you access to your child's learning journal) and choose be notified when your child adds new content.

In order for your child to use Seesaw to document their learning, we need your permission to set up their individual pupil account. Seesaw has a thoroughly robust privacy policy (https://app.seesaw.me/about/privacy) and has committed never to share your child's personal information or journal content.

I hope that your child will enjoy using Seesaw to document and share their learning this year. You can learn more about Seesaw by visiting http://web.seesaw.me/

RE: Collecting pupils from school

This is a reminder with regards to pupils who are being collected late from school, who are being collected by other people than those specified and who are often uncollected altogether.

At our school the safety of your children is of the utmost importance to us, which is why we have the following procedures in place.

Running late

If, when coming to pick your child up from school, you are running late, I ask that on each separate occasion you ring school on <u>01772 795676</u> and inform the school that you are running late and when you can be expected at the school. We also ask that you be mindful of the time at which you notify the school; wherever possible, we ask parents to notify the school no later than **30 minutes** before the specified collect time.

If applicable, please also name the person who will be collecting your child on your behalf. The school may ask you for a description of the individual that you have stated if they are unknown to the school. Pupils of the school will not be released from the school unless staff are completely satisfied that they safe. When parents are not at the school on time to collect their children, pupils will be kept in the **school office** and will be supervised by their **classroom teachers**.

Recurring late pickups

Please note if we note recurring late pickups without a good reason you may be asked into school to discuss this with the Head to plan the next steps.

Non-collection

It is unfeasible to expect school staff to watch pupils after the end of the school day

A member of staff will supervise the pupil and the school will try to contact parents, and other listed emergency contacts, in the event that a child is uncollected from the school. Under no circumstances will school staff go looking for parents. If no contact can be made and no specified adult (someone that has been approved to collect the pupil) has come to collect the pupil within an hour of the original collect time, the school will have no alternative but to follow their child protection procedures and contact children's services or the police.

Collecting a pupil on someone's behalf

The school will never, under any circumstances, allow a pupil to leave the premises with an adult who has not been specified as someone with responsibility for collecting the pupil. If

there is a change in who will be coming to collect a pupil, this **must be communicated to the school**, where a description of the person to ensure your child's safety will be asked for .

It should also be noted that the school will ask the individual who is collecting the pupil for proof of identification, and they should be ready to provide this.

Finally, please have the same consideration for the above when your child is attending an after-school club. In addition, parents are responsible for arranging and ensuring that their child is taken from the school to another club that is held at a different site – teachers will not fulfil this responsibility.

I understand that sometimes emergencies happen which may make the above procedures seem cumbersome; however, I would like to reassure you that the school has these procedures in place for the sole purpose of protecting the pupils of the school. The whole school appreciates your cooperation with following these procedures and we will be understanding of valid explanations and emergencies.

Thank you for taking the time to read this letter. I would like to say thankyou to the vast majority of parents who already follow the school's procedures.
