#### **BEING ON TIME**

It is very important that your child arrives on time each day to enter school through the normal entrance with the rest of their class, and be collected on time after school. Arriving at school is disruptive to others in class and around school, this can also be upsetting for the child arriving late. If you are regularly struggling to arrive on time these tips could help:

- Getting uniform and any necessary equipment or packed lunches ready the night before.
- Setting an alarm clock at an earlier time if your child is slow at getting dressed or eating their breakfast.
- If you are experiencing traffic delays/problems, try to leave for school at an earlier time
- Going to bed earlier then everyone is not so tired in the morning
- Be firm and consistent with your approach in explaining the need to be on time for school.
